The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program is a non-need base grant program that provides approximately **\$4,000** per year to students who are enrolled in an eligible program and who agree to teach in a high-need field, at a low-income elementary or secondary school as a highly qualified teacher, for at least four years within eight years of completing the program for which the TEACH Grant is awarded. The student must sign a service agreement to this effect, and complete all required counseling prior to receiving a TEACH Grant.

Part 4 - Service Obligation

In exchange for the TEACH grant, candidates must agree to serve as full-time teachers at federally approved schools and within certain high-need fields for at least four academic years within eight years of completing the course of study for which a grant was received. If the grant recipient does not carry out the service obligation, the TEACH grant funds received convert to a direct unsubsidized loan that must be repaid with interest accruing as of the date of disbursement of each grant.
